Subject: Leave-Behind Naloxone Agreement Between Snohomish County and Snohomish County Fire District #5

Scope: The Snohomish County Department of Health is establishing an agreement with Snohomish County Fire District #5 under which the County will provide Naloxone in exchange for data regarding opioid overdoses. The data will be used to track demand for Naloxone and distribute it where it is most needed.

Duration: Upon execution through December 31, 2026

Fiscal Impact: Current Year Future-Year N/A

There is no exchange of funds and no fiscal impact.

Authority Granted: Motion 24-096 authorizes the execution of an agreement with Snohomish County and Snohomish County Fire District #5 to implement a Leave-Behind Naloxone Distribution Program.

Background: Snohomish County Council passed Ordinance No. 23-048 approving form agreements for naloxone distribution (leave-behind program) between Snohomish County and local jurisdictions within Snohomish County on June 7, 2023.

RCW 69.41.095 establishes that any person or “entity” (e.g., police department, homeless shelter) can obtain, possess, and administer naloxone.

In response to an Executive Directive issued by Executive Dave Somers in May of 2023, the Opioid Response Multi-Agency Coordination developed goals including “Reduce negative health outcomes, including death, by expanding available resources for individuals who misuse or abuse drugs,” and identifies near-term strategies, including “supply and support naloxone leave-behind program for first responders.”

Requested Action: Move to GLS on February 28, 2024, for consideration.
