DISCUSSION ITEM:

1. DUI Memorial Wall - Stacey McShane, Sheriff's Office [2021-0258](#)

Stacey McShane, Sheriff's Office, shared the Sheriff's Office is in the process of moving the DUI Memorial Wall out of McCollum Park. She explained it had been frequently vandalized and failed to provide wheelchair access. The Sheriff's Office is working with facilities and parks to move it to the County Campus where it can be guarded and have room to grow.

Ms. McShane acknowledged the recent loss of Officer Mark Brinkman with the City of Lynnwood. Officer Brinkman was a founding member of the original wall and Ms. McShane is asking to dedicate a plaque in his memory. Ms. McShane said the wall is tentatively scheduled for dedication for approximately August 20th.

Committee Chair Low said the commemorative plaque is a great idea and requested an early invite to the Wall Dedication.

Committee Member Dunn thanked Ms. McShane for bringing this forward, working with families, and adding the update to include a dedication for Officer Brinkman.
