Subject: Contract with City of Marysville re: Gissberg Twin Lakes.

Scope: Motion 24-265 approves and authorizes the County Executive to sign the intergovernmental agreement with the City of Marysville for lake management and water quality services for an amount not to exceed \$150,000.

Duration: January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2029.

The estimated cost for a typical year of monitoring is \$10,000. If there is a re-emergence of invasive species such as Eurasian Milfoil, the costs can be much higher. Under the agreement, both parties shall agree on the annual costs by October 1 of the preceding year. In all cases, the City of Marysville will re-imburse Snohomish County up to the maximum amount.

Authority Granted:

Authorization for the Executive to sign the intergovernmental agreement.

Background:

Marysville and Snohomish County both recognize the importance of performing certain water quality monitoring and invasive aquatic plant management Services. Since 2006, Snohomish County has provided water quality monitoring services to other jurisdictions and has the staff and resources available to provide this service for Marysville as well. Under the agreement Marysville, the County Surface Water Management division would monitor and, if necessary, remediate invasive plant species at Gissberg Twin Lakes.
