- Enrollment Update at the end of April
 - Currently enrolled at 80
 - o There are no vacancies over 30 days
 - There are 16 eligible children and pregnant persons on the waitlist with others in the process of enrolling in August
 - Program will continue to over-enroll, as possible, to ensure full enrollment as children exit

- Staffing updates
 - Temporary ITS position filled to cover extended maternity leave. Alejandra Wood hired 6/2/25. Hiring was consistent with County policies and procedures.

- Policy Council Update
 - Policy Council elected a new Chair
 - o Policy Council recommended approval of the 2025 Self-Assessment
 - Policy Council recommended approval of the 2026 Year1 Renewal Grant Application: Program Budget

Updates Office of Head Start

- Notice of Award
 - Snohomish County received a Notice of Award (NOA) for the second half of funds on May 29, 2025 (the letter was dated May 15,2025)
 - NOA has been under legal review; Snohomish County submitted a response today related to the recent court injunction.
- Full Enrollment Initiative
 - Program was notified that OHS completed a review of the December 2024 program enrollment data at the end of February and thus did not officially begin our 6-month monitoring period until March of 2025. The 6-month monitoring period will be March, April, May, September, October and November.

Supplemental Grant – Health and Nutrition

EHS program received notice that we are eligible to apply for Supplemental Grant funds

- Focus is on strengthening nutrition services and skills for families and staff
- Preferred submission date is August 22 (2.5-week turnaround time was provided) but can be submitted at any time
- Kristina reviewed proposed Snohomish County EHS application for these supplemental funds
- This application requires approval by the governing body
- Requesting that the Advisory Committee recommend approval by the County Council for supplemental application, pending recommendation by Policy Council
 - Action: recommend approval by the County Council for supplemental application, pending recommendation by Policy Council
 - o Motion Council Member Mead; Second Karla Beers; Motion passed
