RELATING TO THE 2025-2026 BUDGET, MAKING AN
EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION IN FUND 100 TO INCREASE
EXPENDITURE AUTHORITY FOR THE PROSECUTING
ATTORNEY TO COVER UNANTICIPATED LOSS OF REVENUE
BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. The County Council makes the following findings of fact: An emergency appropriation of \$140,000 is necessary in the Community Impact (Special Revenue) Fund 100, in the Prosecuting Attorney's 2025-2026 budget, to increase expenditure authority to absorb expenses creating a negative cash balance in Fund 118, Crime Victim Witness Fund caused by an unanticipated reduction in revenue.

Section 2. The appropriation details for the emergency appropriation are as follows:

The level to which funding would be reduced was not known at the time Council adopted the 2025-2026 budget. The County Council therefore finds that the need for the appropriation authorized by this ordinance constitutes a public emergency that could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of budget adoption for 2025-2026 and hereby authorizes the appropriation.

At the Public Hearing, the Council may consider amendments to the proposed ordinance.
