39 40 41	When planning government-funded projects or soliciting and reviewing bids for such projects, county departments shall consider whether compost products, as defined in RCW 43.19A.010, can be utilized in the project.		
42 43 44 45	In purchasing compost products, the county shall give priority to compost products from companies that produce compost products locally, are certified by a nationally recognized organization, and produce compost products that are derived from		
46	municipal solid waste compost programs and meet quality standards comparable
