### **Subject:** Indigent Defense Contracts – Conflict Pannel

Approve an agreement with Margaret McGinty to provide indigent defense services when there is a conflict with the County's primary contractor, the Snohomish County Public Defender's Association. The most notable change from prior year contracts is found in Schedule B, Compensation which increases the per hour rate for Superior and District Court miscellaneous proceedings; miscellaneous criminal proceedings; RALJ; and child representation in dependency proceedings. Additionally, this contract includes all indigent defense services under one contract instead of multiple contracts with the same attorney for different types of cases.

## Fiscal Impact: Current Year Multi-Year N/A

The total amount appropriated in the 2025-2026 budget across the DAC's listed in the ECAF is \$5.6M (conflict panel plus child dependency and a superior court DAC). For conflict/indigent defense contracts over the 2025-2026 contract period:

- <u>Previously Approved</u>: Thirty seven (37) contracts for \$350k annually/each (*approved in <u>December</u>* and January)
  - Contract Authority Granted: Net \$25.9
- Before you Now: One (1) for \$350k annually/each
  - Contract Authority Granted: Net \$700,000

The net total of approved contract expenditure authority for these DAC's under all 38 contracts is \$26.6M.

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**Background:** The <u>Sixth Amendment</u> of the United States Constitution states that the accused has the right to the assistance of counsel for their defense in criminal prosecutions. As not every defendant can afford an attorney, in 1989 Washington State implemented <u>Chapter 409</u> (RCW 10.101) stating that "legal representation should be provided for indigent persons and persons who are indigent and able to contribute." This chapter also requires counties and cities to establish standards for the delivery of defense services to indigent defendants.

Since the enactment of <u>RCW 10.101</u>, the County has contracted with outside attorneys for legal services to indigent defendants through the courts<sup>1</sup>, and then in 2000 under the Office of Public Defense upon its creation<sup>2</sup>. Today, the largest contract is with the Snohomish County Public Defender Association (PDA), who is the main provider of legal services to indigent defendants in the County. When PDA has a conflict of interest in a case, the case is deferred to one of the County's other contracts that specifically picks up cases where there is a conflict of interest between the defendant and the PDA.

**<u>Requested Action</u>**: For Council to consider taking action.
