Consideration

Proposed Motion 22-052 states that the Snohomish County Council does not oppose the Lake Stevens Sewer District Hisey Annexation and will not invoke the jurisdiction of the Boundary Review Board (BRB). It also directs the Council Clerk to file the motion together with a staff report from Snohomish County Planning and Development Services (PDS) with the BRB.

Background and Analysis

The Lake Stevens Sewer District (“the District”) seeks to annex approximately 17.73 acres known as the Hisey Annexation. This area that is within the incorporated City of Lake Stevens (“the City”), and the District’s planning area. The City is not a sewer service provider; therefore, the District is the logical provider for the area. This is a petition method annexation by a sewer district with an abbreviated 30-day review period that expires on February 9, 2022. The District submitted the Notice of Intention (NOI) to the BRB for the Hisey Annexation that on January 10, 2022 (BRB File No. 01-2022). The BRB, consistent with its annexation review procedures outlined in Chapter 2.77 SCC, distributed the NOI to County departments including PDS. The annexation meets criteria in RCW 57.02.040(3), SCC 2.77.040, and other applicable requirements. Details are available in a staff report from PDS dated January 27, 2022. There are no known conflicts with policy or other reasons for the annexation to not proceed.

Summary and Scope: Approval of the motion states that the County Council does not oppose the annexation and directs the Council Clerk to file the motion with the BRB.
