## **2024 Budget Questions**

- 1. Please provide a breakdown by:
  - $\checkmark$  The airport has a total of 92 FTE's (2023) and would like to add an additional five (5) FTEs in 2024.
- 2. Of those positions, how many are filled, actively recruiting, or vacant? What unfunded positions from the 2023 budget are you requesting to fund/fill in 2024?
  - ✓ All positions are currently filled or are in the process of active recruitment. We currently have seven positions going through the recruitment process. We have no unfunded positions in 2023 or 2024.
- 3. What are your experiences with a hybrid/remote working environment?
  - ✓ Hybrid work in the aviation industry has brought us all closer together. The Airport currently has no FTEs working remotely full time. Operational & emergency services staff must remain on site, but it has provided flexibility for about 30% of the Airport's workforce. Days and hours permitted for hybrid/remote are based on the specific jobs and roles in the Department. Overall, most meetings occur online regardless of your location, so it's been a positive experience for airport staff that have been able to work a hybrid/remote schedule.
- 4. Please describe how much CARES/ARPA funds your department has requested or received in 2023 and 2024, and the utilization of those funds.
  - ✓ The Airport has <u>not</u> received any CARES Act Funds or ARPA Funds in 2023-2024.
  - ✓ The Airport has applied for a Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriation Act, (CRRSA) via the Airport Coronavirus Response Grant Program (ACRGP) Concessions Grant that the airport is waiting to receive funds from FAA (\$59,339).
  - ✓ The Airport is scheduled to receive \$16.98M in Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), Airport Improvement Program (AIP).

## **Airport Capital Improvement Program- ACIP**

- ➤ The Airport Master Plan guides the airport's capital program which is directly referenced in the County Comprehensive Plan.
- The <u>airport</u> is an <u>enterprise fund</u> that is <u>financially self-sufficient</u> and requires no funds from the General Fund.
- The airport has an aggressive CIP implementation Plan based on our business model and available grant funds.



## **Airport Capital Improvement Program- ACIP**


