Authority Granted: Approve and authorize the County Executive to sign Progressive Design Build Agreement PDB01-23 with Cornerstone General Contractors, Inc., under SCC 3.04.195(5).

Background: Snohomish County Department of Public Works and the Facilities Department have been working together on a plan to redevelop the current Road/Bridge/Fleet Maintenance facility located on 67th Ave NE in Arlington. To mitigate the site's soil contamination, provide stormwater and utility improvements, and replace the road crew/administration building, a Progressive Design-Build method was selected to best fit the needs of this project.

Cornerstone General Contractors, Inc. was one of twelve firms that responded to RFQ-23-001SB and one of four firms responding to RFP-23-044SB, and was selected following all Federal, State and County policies and practices. This agreement was negotiated and will serve as the basis for future phase amendments which will document scope and budget to complete the work.
