This is John & Kristen Sekulich.

We have lived in close proximity to Richmond Road and Filbert Road for the last 23 years. We have concerns around the effects this new street will have on Filbert Road and Richmond Road. There are no turn lanes on Filbert Road at an already dangerous intersection (if the county still mowed shoulders it would help) which is also a large and about to get larger school bus stop. The county had a plan to widen Filbert road like they did below 9<sup>th</sup> Ave years ago but that has never come to fruition. At the same time that the county has allowed hundreds of homes to be built in the same area. Traffic is horrendous on Filbert during peak times. Safety is a huge concern at the corner of Richmond and Filbert as well as 202<sup>nd</sup> both of which will see increased traffic as a result of this development. With the addition of up to 75 homes (conservatively 100+ additional cars making 1-2 trips per day) that may use this new road – this problem will only get worse and the county has done nothing to mitigate this impact.

Years ago (20+) I tried to work with the county to have a streetlight installed at corner of Filbert and Richmond Roads which was denied. This is the bus stop. With the eventual change from daylight savings and large groups of kids in the morning hours of darkness this again becomes a safety concern.

Please consider and let us know plans for increased safety and traffic flow along Filbert Road and the intersections of 202<sup>nd</sup>, Richmond Road and Royal Anne road all of which will see greatly increased traffic.
