<u>Authority Granted:</u> Authorizes the Executive to execute the agreement.

<u>Background:</u> The Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) arrest diversion program is a collaborative community safety effort that offers law enforcement a credible alternative to booking people into jail for criminal activity that stems from unmet behavioral health needs or poverty.¹

Through the approval of Motion 20-121 in June of 2020, the Prosecuting Attorney's Office (PAO) implemented the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) program, funded through grant dollars. The majority of the funding for this program is passed through to other agencies for service administration and delivery. Purpose. Dignity. Action is one of these agencies, performing the administrative side of the program. The most recent contract was approved through Motion 23-555 and subsequently amended through Motion 24-329.

<u>Requested Action:</u> For Council to consider taking action.
