If an aggressive implementation of the CIP is proposed, what is the anticipated outlook for resources to support the implementation in terms of FTEs and revenue sources?

2022-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Aggressive six-year TIP proposed (\$243M)
 - > \$154M construction
 - Current FTEs augmented with consultants
 - ➤ Traffic impact fees usage up 20%
 - > Large projects dependent upon grant funding
 - County Road Fund balance necessary to match grants and meet cash flow needs



2022-2027 TIP Questions - Grants

What grants have been applied for and what dollar amount do you anticipate receiving?

2022-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

- Aggressively seek out grant opportunities (\$93M; 38% of TIP)
 - > \$52M in awarded grants
 - > \$41M in future anticipated grants
- Closely monitor federal and state grant availability
 - > TIB revenue back close to pre COVID levels
- \$16M grants awarded from 2021 applications to date

 - SWRTS tipping floor repair and lane 1 repair
 - Scale automation software

 - 2021-2023 Local Solid Waste Financial Assistance grant \$1.3M
