## **Consideration:**

Relating to ESSHB 1799 and amending SCC 3.04.177.

## Background

ESSHB 1799 was signed into Washington law in March of this year to increase the diversion of organic materials to productive and to reduce methane emissions caused by landfills. The new RCW, 43.19A.150 requires the County adopt a compost procurement ordinance by January 1, 2023. The County has planned to the use of compost in landscaping projects; construction and postconstruction soil amendments; application to prevent soil erosion, filter stormwater runoff, and promote vegetation growth or improve the stability and longevity of roadways; and low-impact development and green infrastructure to filter pollutants or keep water on-site.
