If other county code provisions conflict with this chapter, this chapter's provisions shall prevail.

- 39 (ii) One member selected under RCW 70.05.035(1)(a)(i) should have knowledge of environmental public health.

- (c) Identification of which of the three categories set forth in RCW 70.05.035(1)(a) the candidate represents.

- 20 (c) Developing and regularly updating vision, mission, goals, measurable outcomes, and values statements;
- 22 (d) Setting short- and long-term priorities and strategic plans;
- 23 (e) Ensuring that necessary policies exist new policies are proposed/implemented
- 24 where needed, and existing policies reflect evidence-based public health practices;
- 25 (f) Evaluating existing policies on a regular basis to ensure that they are based on the
- 26 <u>best available evidence for public health practice;</u>
- 27 (g) (Educating the public on local health issues; and
- 28 (h) Engaging in equitable and meaningful community participation.
- 29 ((supervise the maintenance of health and sanitary measures for the protection of
- 30 public health; provide for control and prevention of dangerous, contagious and
- 31 infectious disease; provide for the prevention, control and abatement of nuisances
- detrimental to public health; enact such local rules and regulations as are necessary in
