Summary: The Tulalip Tribes was awarded grant funds from the U.S. Department of Commerce National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Restoring Fish Passage through Barrier Removal Notice of Funding Opportunity to implement the Snohomish Cooperative Salmon Barrier Removal Project. The goal of the grant is to achieve measurable and lasting benefits to native migratory fish populations through fish passage barrier removal. The Tribes' Grant identifies the County as a subrecipient which requires the County and the Tribes to enter into an Interlocal Agreement to implement fish passage projects on Sexton Creek, Williams Creek, and French Creek. The County's goals include removal of four fish passage barriers to restore fish access to approximately 8.7 miles of upstream habitat. The total award amount is \$6,197,308 over the term of the grant through December 31, 2026.




