RE: Reappointment of Becky Megard to the Snohomish County Children's Commission

I am pleased to recommend the reappointment of Becky Megard to the Snohomish County Children's Commission to serve a second four-year term.

Becky Megard resides in Council District 1 and currently holds the position of Chief Program Officer for Domestic Violence Services for Snohomish County. Becky has 30 years in social services in Snohomish County, has extensive experience working with high-risk children, and brings knowledge to the commission on the effects of domestic violence on children.

The Children's Commission was created to advise the County on "issues of health, safety and social services for infants, young children and youth in the community." It is composed of 25 members, including at least two youth commissioners. Three members are appointed from each council district, while the remaining ten at-large appointees may reside anywhere within the county. Commissioners serve four-year terms with the exception of youth commissioners, who serve one-year terms. Commissioners may not serve more than three consecutive terms. The Snohomish County Children's Commission currently has 15 members and 10 vacancies. Human Services staff and the Commission are actively engaged in recruitment to fill vacancies.

Pursuant to SCC 2.03.030, I recommend Council confirmation of Becky Megard to be reappointed to the Snohomish County Children's Commission to serve a second four-year term.
