Background: The Washington Department of Health supports local health jurisdictions (LHJs) and tribes in their disease and injury surveillance and control activities by providing timely access to data. ESSENCE data is some of the timeliest information available, with over 90% of emergency departments reporting visits within 24 hours. LHJs and tribes use this information to identify and respond quickly to public health threats such as novel pathogens, as well as track injury and health condition trends, evaluate interventions implemented, and use ESSENCE data within their statutory authority to provide quality public health services.

On October 25, 2023, Council approved Ordinance 23-091 authorizing the county Executive to execute an agreement with the WA DOH for access to ESSENCE data for the purpose of monitoring opioid overdose data and other programmatic uses.
