**Subject:** Leave-Behind Naloxone Agreement Between Snohomish County and Snohomish County Fire District 24

**Scope:** The Snohomish County Department of Health is establishing an agreement with Snohomish County Fire District 24 under which the County will provide naloxone in exchange for data regarding opioid overdoses. The data will be used to track demand for naloxone and distribute it where it is most needed.

A naloxone leave-behind agreement provides local jurisdictions and tribes with naloxone to leave behind with individuals they encounter.

**Duration:** Upon execution through December 31, 2026. Agreement may be extended for one additional three-year term, contingent upon appropriation of funds for this specific purpose.

**Authority Granted:** Motion 24-354 authorizes the execution of an agreement between Snohomish County and Snohomish County Fire District 24 to implement a leave-behind naloxone distribution program.

**Background:** Snohomish County Council passed Ordinance No. 23-048<sup>1</sup> approving form agreements for naloxone distribution (leave-behind program) between Snohomish County and local jurisdictions within Snohomish County on June 7, 2023.

RCW 69.41.095<sup>2</sup> establishes that any person or “entity” (e.g., police department, homeless shelter) can obtain, possess, and administer naloxone.

In response to an Executive Directive<sup>3</sup> issued by Executive Dave Somers on May 18, 2023, the Opioid Response Multi-Agency Coordination developed goals including “Reduce negative health outcomes, including death, by expanding available resources for individuals who misuse or abuse drugs,” and identifies near-term strategies, including “supply and support naloxone leave-behind program for first responders<sup>4</sup>.”

**Requested Action:** Consider taking action.
