# 2022 Historic Preservation Grants Recommendations Summary

**Background Summary:** By providing matching funds on a competitive basis, the Historic Preservation Program supports projects that promote the public's access to county history. Funding is available for professional development, public education, and capital improvements or collections management. Money is awarded from recording fees collected by the Snohomish County Auditor. The allocation of these fees for projects that "promote historical preservation or historical programs, which may include preservation of historic documents" is authorized under RCW 36.22.170. The revenues accrue to a dedicated fund and may not be used for any purposes other than those stipulated in the RCW.

**Summary:** The commission met on February 15, 2022 to review 12 grant requests. Commissioners Jennifer Hushour, Frederick Cruger, Katelyn Murray, Chris Jenkins and Franklin Ng were present. There were \$291,675 in grant requests was submitted for \$100,000 in grant funding. The Historic Preservation Commission recommends grant funding to 11 out of the 12 projects reviewed:

## CHP 2022 01

Project Applicant: Imagine Children's Museum Project: Bicycle Tree Exhibit Council District: 2 Project Budget: \$95,000 Amount Requested: \$25,000.00 Recommendation: \$0 No funding recommended.



The project will provide support for final design, production and installation of a permanent exhibit that recreates the historic Snohomish Bicycle Tree. The exhibit will portray vintage bicycles and provide education and interaction with the historic nature of landmarks and evolution of cycling.

## CHP 2022 02

Project Applicant: Stanwood Area Historical Society Project: Public Education Speaker Series Council District: 1 Project Budget: \$5,150 Amount Requested: \$2,400 Recommendation: \$2,400 Full funding recommended



The project will support public education in the form of a monthly speaker's series. Each speaker will present their research on a variety of topic including historical flood control and diking as well as speakeasies during the Prohibition era, among other subjects.

Project Applicant: Downtown Everett Association Project: Public Education Historic Masonry Council District: 2 Project Budget: \$4,000 Amount Requested: \$1,500



## Recommendation: \$1,500 full funding recommended

This project will support professional development and local preservation by creating a walking tour of downtown Everett to identify and discuss maintenance and best practices repair of historic masonry buildings.

#### CHP 2022 04

Project Applicant: Mukilteo Historical Society Project: Equipment to store and digitize historical images Council District: 2 Project Budget: \$4,900 Amount Requested: \$4,900

# Recommendation: \$4,900 full funding recommended

This project will purchase and scanner and software that are capable of digitizing old photo negatives. The images will then be accessible to the public through and on-line website. A fire-proof cabinet will also be purchased to increase capacity and help protect historical items in the collection.

Project Budget: \$37,105

Amount Requested: \$8,250

## Recommendation: \$6,960 Recommended for partial funding

Project will add Snohomish County content to HistoryLink.org focusing on Snohomish County people, businesses and places that have shaped the County's history. 2022 focus will include 16 new articles and a self-guided walking tour of the City of Snohomish incorporating the new Heritage Trail. Subjects include Ken Griffey Jr.'s first professional homerun at Everett Memorial Stadium and Harland Eastwood writer, historian and one-armed forest ranger with connections to Snohomish County lookouts and Verlot Ranger Station.

Project will produce and design three history exhibits to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary honoring the club's history and the oldest garden club in the state.

CHP 2022 11 **Project Applicant: Snohomish Historical Society Project: Museum Painting Council District: 5** Project Budget: \$17,500-20,000 Amount Requested: \$17,500 **Recommendation: \$17,500 Recommended for full Funding.** 

The project proposes to paint the historic Blackman House which houses the Snohomish Historical Society Museum and administration. The Blackman House is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Project Applicant: Stillaguamish Valley Pioneer Museum-Structural Project: Preservation of Pioneer Hall

Council District: 1

Project Budget: \$19,100

Amount Requested: \$4,900

Recommendation: \$4,900 full funding recommended



Project proposes to preserve and 1,530 lineal feet of Pioneer Hall's exterior walls of the 100 year-old building. The funds will be used to purchase materials necessary to log preparation, treatment for insect extermination, installation of or backer rods and chinking application. Labor will be performed by volunteers.
