BACKGROUND: Snohomish County Code is amended to clarify the process by which Ethics Complaints are completed, considered, and then acted on for dismissed)
ORDINANCE NO. 21-100
RELATED TO THE CODE OF ETHICS:
AMENDING SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE 2,50-110
Section 1 SCC Section 2,50-110 Complaint procedures, subsections (1) and (3) are amended as follows:
(1) Any natural parson who believes a person subject to the code of ethics has committed a violation of the code may file a complaint with the ethics commission. Complaints shall be subject to the following requirements:
(a) The complaint must be based upon facts within the personal knowledge of the complainant;
(b) The complaint must be based upon facts within the personal knowledge of the complainant;
(c) The complaint must be based upon facts within the personal with the complainant in the subject to the object of the complainant;
(c) The complaint must be submitted in writing and signed under oath by the complainant;
(c) The complaint must include a detailed factual description of the alleged violation including the date, time and place of each occurrence and the name of the person or persons who are alleged to have been violated).

(d) The complaint must be accompanied by all available documentation or other evidence known to the complainant to support the allegations of the complaint;
(e) The complaint must refer to the specific provisions of the date of the occurrence and courrence or courrences alleged to constitute a violation of the code of ethics which are alleged to have been violated.

(3) The clerk shall forward the complaint and any accompanying documentation and evidence forthwith to the chairperson of the code of ethics which are alleged to have been violated.
