Background: Snohomish County Council passed Ordinance No. 23-048¹ approving form agreements for naloxone distribution (leave-behind program) between Snohomish County and local jurisdictions within Snohomish County on June 7, 2023.

RCW 69.41.095² establishes that any person or "entity" (e.g., police department, homeless shelter) can obtain, possess, and administer naloxone.

In response to an Executive Directive³ issued by Executive Dave Somers in May of 2023, the Opioid Response Multi-Agency Coordination developed goals including "Reduce negative health outcomes, including death, by expanding available resources for individuals who misuse or abuse drugs," and identifies near-term strategies, including "supply and support naloxone leave-behind program for first responders."

<u>Requested Action</u>: Move to GLS on December 6, 2023, for consideration.
