Appointing Commissioner to represent Organized Labor on the Citizens' Commission on Salaries of Elected Officials.

Background

Snohomish County Ordinance 07-053, passed in June of 2007, established the Snohomish County Citizen's Commission on Salaries of Elected Officials. Local code charges the Auditor with randomly selecting six Snohomish County citizens – one from each Council District and one at-large – from the county voter registration rolls to serve on the Commission on Salaries. The County Executive is responsible for nominating four individuals – one from each of the following sectors; business, personnel management, legal profession, and organized labor.

For 2022, Charlotte Murry has expressed interest in being appointed to represent Organized Labor. Charlotte Murry is the Executive Director of Washington State Council of County and City Employees, AFSCME AFL-CIO, Council 2. Additionally, she is a Stanwood School District Board Member and an active community volunteer.
