The agreement clarifies who has jurisdiction and authority for law enforcement actions and how the two entities work together. Under the agreement: <ul> <li>Tribal officers who have successfully completed state requirements pursuant to RCW 43.101.157 may exercise general Washington peace officer authority as provided in RCW 10.92 within the exterior boundaries of the Reservation and throughout Snohomish County as provided by RCW 10.93.070;</li> <li>The Chief of Police has sole discretion to grant or deny Tribal Commissioned Sheriff's Deputies – the tribal commission may be suspended or revoked at any time;</li> <li>The Stillaguamish Tribe will execute an Interlocal Agreement for Jail Services with Snohomish County;</li> <li>The Triba is responsible for any civil liabilities arising by the acts of their Tribal officers and the County is responsible for any civil liabilities arising by the acts of their Tribal officers and the operational protocols based on where the offense occurred and who committed the offense</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
