**Subject:** Naloxone Distribution Agreement's – Amendment #1– City of Bothell

**Scope:** Extend the Naloxone Distribution Agreements through 2030.

**Duration:** December 31, 2030, and may be extended for up to two additional five-year terms.

**Fiscal Impact:**  Current Year  Multi-Year  N/A (no exchange of funds)

**Authority Granted:** Authorizes the Executive to execute the amendment.

**Background:** CW 69.41.095<sup>1</sup> establishes that any person or "entity" (e.g., police department, homeless shelter) can obtain, possess, and administer naloxone.

The underlying "Agreement for Distribution and Acceptance of Naloxone" was executed on October 6, 2022 for the City of Bothell.

On October 26, 2022, Council approved Ordinance 22-061<sup>2</sup> creating the Health Department, fund, and other operational aspects of the new department. On the same day, Council passed Ordinance 22-060<sup>3</sup> approving an Interlocal Agreement with the Health District, transferring its employees, operations, powers, duties, enforcement, and assets to the County. The Snohomish Health District integrated into Snohomish County effective December 31, 2022, and now operates as the Snohomish County Health Department; These agreements were assigned to the new Health Department.

Under the terms of the agreement, naloxone is provided to the jurisdictions at no cost. The jurisdiction designates a Naloxone Liaison to track naloxone supplies and report data on the use and storage of the medication to the Snohomish County Health Department.
