Subject: Data Sharing Agreement with Washington State Department of Health for Access to the Washington State Healthy Youth Survey

Scope: The Health Department is seeking to enter into an agreement with the Washington State Department of Health for access to Washington State Healthy Youth Survey 2002-2027 data.

For access to school identifiers, Snohomish County Health Department must obtain written permission from the principals of any school where data may be reported in a way that identifies the school. Permission may not be necessary if it will be shared in a way that does not reveal the identity of the school (e.g., north or south areas of the county), as long as it is reported in a way that does not identify the school.

Snohomish County may not attempt to identify any student that participated in the survey and may not release, divulge, publish, transfer, sell or otherwise make known to unauthorized persons identifiable Survey information.

Snohomish County must comply with Washington State Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) security standard [141.10 Securing Information Technology Assets](#).

Authority Granted: Ordinance 25-001 authorizes the Executive, or designee, to execute the data sharing agreement and all subsequent amendments.

Background: The Healthy Youth Survey (HYS) is a multi-agency collaborative research study which collects information from 6th-12th graders in Washington on a range of health indicators that can inform programs and policies related to adolescent health. The County's Health Department will use the HYS datasets for on-going assessment activities, including tracking trends for public health indicators, preparing reports on specific public health issues, and responding to requests for data from the public and other public agencies.
