PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 24-098

APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE
TO SIGN AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN
SNOHOMISH COUNTY AND THE CITY OF LYNNWOOD
REGARDING SNOHOMISH COUNTY OUTREACH TEAM

Background: The ordinance approves an Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with the City of Lynnwood for a Snohomish County Outreach Team member for 2024. The purpose of the ILA is to set forth the duties between the City and the County regarding an ongoing program that embeds a County-employed social worker within Lynnwood and Mountlake Terrace's police force. The one FTE position is split 50/50 between the City of Lynnwood and the City of Mountlake Terrace. The goal of the program is to provide an alternative police response to those with social service needs in the Cities of Lynnwood and Mountlake Terrace. The social worker will provide assistance to police responses for people with behavioral health, housing, and financial needs. The program aims to bridge gaps between law enforcement and social services in our community to better coordinate response and follow up for individuals that can benefit from those services. The social worker will also be responsible for providing social service training for officers. The length of the ILA will be five months; August 1, 2024 through December, 31 2024. The City of Lynnwood will pay \$105,401 towards the salary and other expenses for the position for 2024. The social worker will be a County employee supervised by Snohomish County's Human Services Department.

At the Public Hearing, the Council may consider amendments to the proposed ordinance.

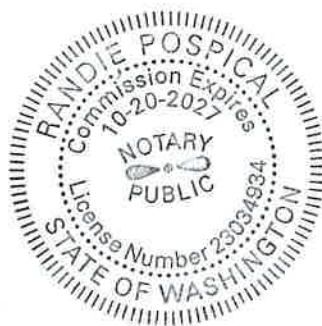
