Authority Granted:

Supplemental appropriation authority to spend \$450,000 Parks Construction Fund 309 for work at Kayak Point Park that was unanticipated in the 2024 budget. Charter Section 6.80 requires an ordinance to adopt the supplemental appropriation.

Background:

Snohomish County Parks obtained \$450,000 funding from the Port of Everett as part of a Consent Decree to settle a dispute regarding National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit requirements. Snohomish County accepted these funds by Motion 23-377. As part of the settlement, the parties identified Snohomish County's Kayak Point Park pier piling replacement project for receiving supplemental environmental project funds. Use of these funds must go to the water quality project planned at Kayak Point Park. The funds provide by the Port of Everett are integral to a multi-million dollar water quality improvement project. Without these funds, replacement of the affected creosote piles would not happen at this time.
