Ken Klein, Executive Director, provided opening remarks and a brief summary of the Compensation and Classification Study Findings.

Ruth Ann Eledge, Vice President, The Segal Group, provided a presentation on the Study, highlighting the County's goal, project scope, job analysis, overview of compensable factors, market assessment process, pay structure development, proposed general pay range, and on-going maintenance. She noted that the market assessment findings show that the County's pay practices and policies are generally competitive with the market and the average employer annual contribution for health benefits exceed the market weighted average.

Discussion followed, as Ms. Eledge and Mr. Klein, along with Rhea Reynolds, Human Resources Director, responded to questions relating to the findings and recommendations of the Study.

Heidi Beazizo, Council Chief of Staff, provided an overview of the request by Okanogan County for neighboring counties to join the request for Cooperating Agency status as the National Park Service prepares the 2022 North Cascades Ecosystem Grizzly Bear Restoration Plan/Environmental Impact Statement.
