## **Consideration:**

The proposal relates to the Snohomish County Standing Committees and amends Chapters 2.48 of the Snohomish County Code<sup>1</sup>.

## **Background:**

Snohomish County has five standing committees that are named within the Snohomish County Code. These five committees have set schedules with regular established meeting times<sup>2</sup>. Standing committees are advisory bodies to the County Council (Legislative authority).<sup>3</sup>

## **Current Proposal:**

*Scope:* Proposed Ordinance 21-041 would amend Chapters 2.48.110 and 2.48.170(3), of the Snohomish County Code, relating to the titles of committees. The proposed ordinance would change the two committee names to better reflect their current body of work that is managed under each committee.

This proposal recommends renaming the Operations Committee into the Conservation, Sustainability and Recreation Committee.

This proposal recommends renaming the Public Works Committee into the Public Works and Infrastructure Committee.

The proposed ordinance will assist in providing clarity to the public and staff regarding the body of work that is managed under each committee for greater government transparency.
