Background: The only safe entry and egress from the Aqua Hills neighborhood was cut off when a bridge and culvert crossing Mission Creek at 12th Avenue NW were destroyed in a storm on March 1, 2024. Snohomish County proclaimed a state of emergency on March 18th, 2024 because of the environmental damage and inability to provide emergency response.
