### **Consideration**

Proposed Motion 23-290 would approve and authorize the County Executive to execute DDA County Program Services Agreement, Contract #2363-48746.

### **Background and Analysis**

DDA is the Developmental Disabilities Administration, a division of the Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS). DDA County Program Services Agreements provide funding for the County's community services for children's early learning intervention, adult employment, and community support services for individuals with disabilities living in Snohomish County. Snohomish County Humans Services will use the funds mainly to subcontract with agencies targeting beneficial community outcomes, serving an estimated 3,000 adults and children with disabilities.

The grant period is July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2025. The amount awarded is \$13,160,622. The adopted 2023 Grant Work Program includes these funds (Fund 124). No impact fiscal impact to general revenue (Fund 002) from this contract. The funds awarded will reimburse all costs for the program. No matching funds required.

The Snohomish County Charter grants the County Council has authority over contracts and budgets ([Charter 2.20](#)) and requires action by Motion ([Charter 2.140](#)). [SCC 4.26.025](#) provides for Council authority on motions related to Grant Work Plan revisions. In addition to approving the grant and authorizing the Executive to execute the Agreement for it, Motion 23-290 authorizes the Executive to execute any amendments to the Agreement.

### **Current Proposal**

*Summary:* Motion 23-290 would approve the DDA grant, authorize the Executive the execute the Agreement, and authorize the Executive to make amendments.
