22	Inslee proclaimed a public health emergency for COVID-19. On March 4, 2020, the
23	Snohomish County Health Officer proclaimed a countywide public health emergency for

25	Emergency Snohomish County" for COVID-19 (the "Emergency"). On March 13, 2020,
