2526	"Local Proclamation of Emergency Snohomish County" for COVID-19 (the "Emergency"). On March 13, 2020, the President of the United States of America declared COVID-19 a National

29	WHEREAS, on December 27, 2020, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2021 (the
30	"Act") was signed into law. The Act included emergency rental assistance established by Section
31	501 of Division N of the Act, providing funds for rental and utility assistance to states and units of
32	local government through the Department of Treasury; and

34	WHEREAS, the Washington State Department of Commerce has provided such funds to
35	Snohomish County for rental and utility assistance.
