Background: This ordinance adopts amendments to Snohomish
County Code (SCC) relating to the regulation pertaining to roads
and access. A summary of the proposed ordinance is as follows:
PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 21-106
Section 51, 2, and 3, Adopt recitals, findings, and conclusions, and
states that the Snohomish County Council bases its decision on
the entire record.

PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 21-106

Sections 1, 2, and 3, Adopt recitals, findings, and conclusions, and states that the Snohomish County Council bases its decision on the entire record.

Section 4, Amends SCC 30.24,050 to allow the county engineer to determine the type of roadway required to provide access to a proposed subdivision, short subdivision, binding site plan development, or single family detached unit. The proposed amendment removes the requirement to seek a variance if an applicant proposes a private road instead of a public road. New language is proposed to allow a private road or drive aisle for access to a proposed subdivision, short subdivision, binding site plan development, or single family detached unit unless the county engineer determines that a public road is required to provide for the public health, safety and welfare or connectivity of the public road system.

Section 5, Amends SCC 30.24.055 to allow the county engineer to determine the type of roadway required to serve individual lots, tracts, or easements within a proposed subdivision. The proposed amendment removes the requirement to seek a variance if an applicant proposes a private road network element instead of a public road to serve individual lots, tracts, or easements within a proposed subdivision. Amendment 1. This amendment adds a new section to chapter 30.41C SCC, supported by a new finding, providing that an applicant with a pending application for a rural cluster subdivision permit may request that SCC 30.41C.080 as amended apply to the pending application. The code section allowing the optional application SCC 30.41C.080 as amended will expire 12 months from the effective date of the ordinance. State Environmental Pokey Act.
