Execution of the Sub-Award Agreement will not impact the adopted 2024 County Budget. Funding for the Adopt A Stream Foundation comes from part a larger grant from the Washington State Department of Ecology for the Floodplains by Design program that Snohomish County has already received. Ecology Grant Agreement #SEAFBD-2325-SnCoCN-00046 (the “County Grant”) to implement the Community Floodplain Solutions – Phase III Implementation Project includes identification of Adopt A Stream as a sub-awardee. In the Ecology grant, the County would enter into a sub-award agreement to pass through the subject grant funds to Adopt A Stream.

**Authority Granted:**

Authorization to execute a Sub-Award Agreement with Adopt A Stream.

**Background:**

The grant from Ecology provides funding for habitat and flood mitigation work in several locations. The Sub-Award earmarked for Adopt A Stream involves work at Al Borlin Park in the City of Monroe. Under the scope of work, Adopt A Stream would investigate the feasibility of creating side channels to benefit Chinook and other salmonids. Deliverables include water testing, meetings with city staff, and submitting conceptual designs to DCNR by June 30, 2027.

Construction of any conceptual designs produced by the current Sub-Award Agreement with will require separate approvals and funding.
