The new Collective Bargaining Agreement and consequent salary adjustment for DPAs has stemmed the tide of departures, ushered in a host of qualified new applicants, and paved the way for our office to fill all open DPA positions for the first time in nearly 7 years.

Please provide a list of non-budget challenges facing your programs in the upcoming biennial budget cycle:

- 1. Defense case load standards.
- 2. The monumental increase in digital medial evidence.
- 3. The legislature continuing to place greater, time-intensive burdens on prosecutors, such as conducting discretionary felony resentencing reviews (with a newly proposed bill to allow direct resentencing petitions as a matter of right); and defending NGRI post-plea adjudications, all without funding such work, while simultaneously reducing victim penalty assessments.
