

CARES and ARPA/CLFR

CARES

- 2021 request: \$8,000,000
- 2021 received: \$10,012,342
 - Childcare for essential workers: \$4.3m
 - ► Food security: \$1.85m
 - Mass vaccination: \$2.0m
 - ▶ I & Q facility: \$1.35m
 - ► EOC staff: \$400k

ARPA/CLFR

- 2021 request: \$1,500,000
- 2021 received: \$1,500,000
 - Contact tracing, testing, ineligible mass vaccination costs
- 2022 request: \$10,000,000
 - Continue existing programs
 - Provide flexibility for contingencies
 - ▶ PPE
 - ▶ Healthcare system
 - Schools
 - ► Resumption of mass vaccinations

2021 Targeted Reduction

- ▶ DEM anticipates meeting its targeted reduction.
 - ► Some staff costs reimbursable under FEMA's Public Assistance program

Legislative/Policy Impacts

- Federal DHS/FEMA Policy
 - ► The FY 2021 Homeland Security Grant Program Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) reads, "Applicants are strongly encouraged to begin planning to sustain existing capabilities through funding mechanisms other than DHS preparedness grants."
 - In future grant cycles, FEMA will request project-level detail upfront during the application period. Subrecipients have previously had until August to complete this work.
- State Budget Proviso
 - ► Task force to conduct a comprehensive after-action review of the statewide pandemic response and recovery.
 - ▶ ~50 members, only <u>two</u> representing local emergency management agencies.
 - ▶ One primary focus Whether establishing regional emergency management agencies would benefit Washington state emergency response to future pandemics.
