1. American Rescue Plan Act Timeline Discussion

> Council Chair Wright provided opening comments and requested information from the Executive's Office, relating to the use and disbursement of American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

Ken Klein, Executive Director, responded to Council's questions and provided additional information on the proposed timeline for the allocation of ARPA funds. He noted that proposed legislation is forthcoming for Council consideration.

Council Vice-Chair Dunn made a motion that the County Council reject the proposed amended Joint Chapter 11 Plan of Reorganization of Purdue Pharma L.P. and its affiliated debtors as set forth by the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of New York in Case No. 19-23649, and direct our attorneys to file the necessary ballot on behalf of Snohomish County. Councilmember Mead seconded the motion.

Council Vice-Chair Dunn explained the motion to reject the proposed settlement, and Council Chair concurred.
