The Department of Health CMT portal identifies carbapenemase producing organism (CPO) cases and Candida auris (C. auris) cases.
□Other  Requested Handling: □Normal □Expedite □Urgent		The purpose of this data sharing agreement is to provide Local Health Jurisdiction (LHJ) investigator access to the CMT portal managed by the DOH Multi-Drug Resistant Organism (MDRO) Team which is part of the Antibiotic Resistance and Healthcare Associated Infections Program in the Office of Communicable Disease Epidemiology.

<u>Background:</u> Candida auris was first reported in Washington in 2023 and has been detected in patients in several healthcare facilities and counties since January 2024. As has occurred in many US states, Candida auris may spread among highly vulnerable patients in high acuity long term care facilities (for example, sites caring for patients needing long term ventilator support). Facilities can prevent transmission by strengthening infection prevention programs and auditing practices.

On January 31, 2024, the Snohomish County Health Department <u>reported</u> that patients who tested positive for Candida auris in King County had been treated at healthcare facilities within Snohomish County. Multiple rounds of screenings were completed at impacted facilities in Snohomish County, and these returned negative results.

A <u>dashboard</u> showing trends in multi-drug resistant organism data is available on the DOH website.

On April 24, 2024, Council approved a data sharing agreement with the Washington State Department of Health for access to information related to cases of multi-drug resistant carbapenemase producing organisms and Candida auris via Ordinance 24-020<sup>2</sup>. This agreement expires on June 30, 2025.
