**Authority Granted:** N/A.

**Background:** RCW 39.34.303 and SCC 3.04.220 allow that County to enter into intergovernmental cooperative purchasing agreements with other public agencies. In 2013, Snohomish County began including language in its solicitations to allow other public agencies to purchase from contracts awarded by the County. The City of Granite Falls and Snohomish County each desire to make purchases, from time to time, from contracts the other has awarded as a result of a competitive process.

Council approval is required for all intergovernmental cooperative purchasing agreements.
