Subject: Temporary Easement Agreement.

Scope: The Washington State Department of Transportation has need to acquire a temporary easement for access of two parcels owned by Snohomish County (Tax ID 28051300301700 & 28051300403000) to allow for the widening and painting of the Snohomish River bridge across SR 9, Marsh Road to 2nd Street.

Fiscal Impact: Current Year Multi-Year N/A

WSDOT will pay Snohomish County \$5,800 for the temporary easement and for access to county owned property.

Duration: From execution until January 31, 2034, construction shall be limited to no more than 36-consecutive months during the Term and will be followed by a consecutive 3-year Plant Establishment period.

Authority Granted: Approves of the execution and recordation of the temporary easement for widening and painting of Snohomish River bridge across SR 9, Marsh Road to 2nd Street; and authorizes the Property Officer of the Department of Facilities and Fleet, Property Management Division to sign the Temporary Easement on behalf of the County and any and all other documents necessary to effectuate the temporary easement in accordance with the terms and conditions, under SCC 13.70.010(2).

Background: The Washington State Department of Transportation has the need to use a small portion of property owned by Snohomish County to stage and store equipment while widening and painting the Snohomish River bridge crossing at SR9 and Marsh Road to 2nd Street. The identified parcels are part of the Snohomish River Trail Park, but no active trail is currently installed or currently planned to be installed on the parcels. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources Stormwater Management and Parks divisions, Department of Public Works and Department of Facilities and Fleet, Property Management division recommend the execution of the temporary easement.

Requested Action: For Council to move the motion to GLS on April 10, 2024, for consideration.
