The City of Lynnwood is excited to apply for the Small Capital Project Partnership (SCPP) grant with our partner the Lynnwood Parks & Recreation Foundation. We have a long history of partnering with the Foundation to complete small and large capital projects including the Interurban Trail 40th Plaza, Heritage Park Water Tower (currently under construction), and the Lynndale Skate Park Playground Replacements (SCPP grant), to name a few.

This application is for the Meadowdale Playfields Playground Replacement and new ADA path and parking stalls. The playground at the Playfields is the oldest in our park system, constructed in 1990. This park is also the busiest park in our entire system with more than 285,000 visits per year.

Lynnwood is committed to addressing deferred maintenance in our system along with removing all known ADA barriers documented in our ADA Transition Plan. Replacing playgrounds and increasing accessibility are a top priority included in the Lynnwood Capital Facilities Plan, project #PK2000034A, and included in the City's 21/22 Capital Budget.

This letter serves as our letter of intent to fund and complete the proposed Meadowdale Playfields Playground Replacement and ADA Path. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me.

Overview, Schedule, and Contents

The **Small Capital Projects Partnership** (**SCPP**) provides supporting funds for small capital projects within Snohomish County. Funding is provided by the Real Estate Excise Tax 2 (REET 2) Fund. To be eligible for funding, applicant organizations must partner with a public entity on whose land the field or facility is located. Public entities include: school districts, park districts, utility districts, county and cities. The application is submitted by both the applicant group and the public entity. The goal of the program is to award grants across Snohomish County.

Successful SCPP Grant projects consist of good planning and cooperation between the parties. The ability to demonstrate community need and impact of the project, and the ability to manage and complete the project in a timely fashion within budget are key elements of a strong application. Please carefully read all policies and application materials before you begin filling out the application. The application may be filled out electronically and saved. A hard copy original and three copies must be submitted. Please also include a completed W-9 with your application.

Applications are due September 30, 2021 before 5PM. Proposals will be evaluated against criteria, the primary one being that the project must meet the restrictions for REET 2 funds. REET 2 can be used for "planning, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, repair, replacement, rehabilitation, or improvement of streets, roads, highways, sidewalks, street and road lighting systems, traffic signals, bridges, domestic water systems, storm and sanitary sewer systems, and planning, construction, reconstruction, repair, rehabilitation, or improvement of parks." (See RCW 82.46.035(5)). Note that land acquisition, facilities repair, maintenance or restoration are not qualifying uses of REET 2.

Additional criteria include: expectation that the project will be completed, and funds expended, by December 31, 2022; availability of matching funds; the availability of in-kind materials and labor; the applicants' demonstrated success in completing similar projects; and other relevant information demonstrating the proposed project's value, readiness, and benefit. Projects must be included on the agency's Capital Improvement Plan for 2021. Preference will be given to projects that have not received SCPP awards in two of the last three years. Project agreements will be approved by the Snohomish County Council and executed by the Council Chair. Funding for project initiation will be available to selected applicants as a reimbursement for actual expenses incurred, not to exceed the amount awarded. Copy of County contract is included, and may not be amended.

7. Project Description

Describe the SCPP Grant Project for which funding is requested. Provide a thorough Scope of Services detailing how the funds will be used and how they relate to a master plan if the funds do not complete the project:

The City of Lynnwood in partnership with the Lynnwood Parks & Recreation Foundation plan to replace the aged and out-of-date playground at the Meadowdale Playfields with all new equipment. Leading to this new playground will be a new, ADA 150-linear foot pathway connecting from the north parking lot with two (2) new ADA parking stalls with curb ramp.

This project is estimated to cost \$150,000 with \$100,000 of equipment purchase and installation and \$50,000 for upgrading the ADA parking stalls and construction of new pathways. The Foundation will contribute \$1,000 cash towards the equipment purchase.

This project is in the City's 2021 Capital Facilities Plan as a Deferred Maintenance project, Project #PK2000034A. Our Deferred Maintenance CFP project primarily addresses playground replacements of end-of-life equipment and pathways improvements.

This project will be completed in full by December 31, 2022.

8. Neighborhood/Community Impact

The existing playground at Meadowdale Playfields was installed in 1990, is the oldest in our system, and well beyond it's useful life. The current equipment is limited in play features and designed for ages 5-12 years.

1,800 residents live within a 10-minute walk of this park but it also serves as a regional facility for families visiting for sports practices and games. Meadowdale Playfields is our largest and busiest park in our entire park system with more than 285,000 annual visitors. The Playground and nearby loop path are two very popular features of the park attracting families.

Making ADA improvements and increasing access and inclusion to parks and playgrounds is a top priority for Lynnwood. This park's improvements will directly improve access to a 2nd grade student who lives across the street and relies on mobility assistance by removing a half dozen existing barriers.

9. Proposed Project Management

Please describe how this project is carefully planned and clearly ready to proceed as soon as a grant award is available. The elements of a good plan include: a well-defined scope of work, clear and measurable objectives, activities that will accomplish the objectives within a detailed time frame, indication that the applicant has provided for any specialized knowledge or expertise necessary to accomplish the objectives, and evidence that there is well-established coordination between the joint applicants. Design for this project is planned to begin this fall with outreach to the surrounding neighborhood with an outreach survey.

We plan to work with a playground manufacturer to design a more interactive playground that would appeal to wider ages, and be more accessible. The proposed project replaces a single structure with multiple pieces built for climbing, crawling, and balancing.

Playground equipment will be purchased on a cooperative agreement for best pricing and efficiency. A contractor for both the playground installation and the pathway construction will be selected from the small works roster.

No permits are anticipated for this project; however, if any permits are required, application for City of Lynnwood permits will be submitted 'over-the-counter'. This is a 9-month small capital project included in the City's 2022 CFP as Project #PK2000034A.



10. Proposed Project Design

Please describe how the proposed project is well designed (site plans, drawings, and/or pictures are encouraged). Maximum points will be awarded to projects that are thoughtfully designed and consider the following elements: meeting current and future needs, appropriate and quality materials, potential phasing, efficiencies, maintenance, aesthetics, space relationships, and sustainable or green design.

While not yet designed, this project's goals will be oriented towards increasing the types of features to include climbing, balance, and swinging, as well as touch, cognitive and other inclusive play elements. The upgrading of two parking stalls and addition of a new ADA pathway connecting to play area will remove existing barriers at the site and provide accessibility.

Outreach to inform design will begin in October 2021. Our design approach is to work with a playground manufacturer to develop a playground design that reflects community input.
