**RESOLUTION NO. 24-018**

**RECOGNIZING CONSOLIDATED LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE FOR 14 YEARS  
OF SERVICE AS ADOPT-A-ROAD VOLUNTEERS IN SNOHOMISH COUNTY**

**WHEREAS**, Snohomish County established a local road adoption program in 2008 as a partnership between volunteer groups and the County to curtail roadside litter, improve the quality of the environment, and strengthen civic pride in a litter-free Snohomish County; and

**WHEREAS**, currently, Snohomish County has 50 adoptable segments along its network of 1,600 miles of unincorporated county roads; and

**WHEREAS**, 33 groups made up of individuals, businesses, non-profit, and faith-based organizations are committed to cleaning 39 adopted road segments regularly over a two-year period to help keep communities litter-free; and


**WHEREAS**, Adopt-A-Road is part of a targeted approach by the county to keep our roads free of litter involving the hard work and dedication of volunteers and full-time and seasonal county employees; and

**WHEREAS**, Adopt-A-Road groups perform at least two cleanups throughout the year and collect more than 100 bags of garbage from unincorporated County roadsides; and


**WHEREAS**, the employees of Consolidated Landscape Maintenance, a Marysville-based business, have committed to keeping their adopted section on 34th Ave NE/Stimson Road from 128<sup>th</sup> St NE to 140<sup>th</sup> St NE/Stimson Road litter-free since 2010;




