ACTION ITEMS:

1. Ordinance 22-007, relating to the Department of Information Services; amending chapter 2.350 SCC

Deb Bell, Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained the ordinance would update Snohomish County Code within the Department of Information Technology to align the Code with current county practices. She stated a proposed substitute ordinance has been submitted that includes edits to the ordinance that were submitted after the original ordinance was introduced.

Committee Vice-Chair Dunn expressed her appreciation for the IT Department.

2. Ordinance 22-009, approving and authorizing the vacation and abandonment of a portion of Richmond Road and a portion of 208th Street SE, Snohomish County road rights-of-way

Deb Bell, Legislative Analyst, explained that this ordinance should move along in tandem with Ordinance 22-010 as one is a road vacation and one is road dedication. She then provided a staff report.

4. Motion 22-055, authorizing the County Executive to sign GCB 3615 2022-0120 bridge inspection agreement between Snohomish County and Washington State Department of Transportation

Deb Bell, Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report. She said the term of the agreement is 10 years and the cost is approximately \$380,000.00 but WSDOT will bill for actual costs at the time of service.

5. Motion 22-087, authorizing the county executive to sign professional services agreement CC09-21 with Trowbridge, LLC to provide debris removal services

Deb Bell, Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained this motion would approve an agreement that provides debris removal services.

Responding to Committee Chair Low, Doug McCormick, Public Works Deputy Director, spoke about aging equipment and cost to replace. Larry Brewer, Public Works, spoke about debris removal.

6. Motion 22-088, authorizing the County Executive to sign Professional Services Agreement CC08-21 with Hill International, Inc. to provide project management for progressive design-build design and construction services

Deb Bell, Legislative Analyst, provided a staff report and explained this motion approves an agreement in the amount of \$1,012,505.00 plus additional amendments, provided sufficient appropriation authority exists, for a total amount not to exceed \$1,112,505.00.

Ms. Bell said the scope of this phase is to replace the road crew administration building, provide stormwater and utility improvements, and mitigate the site's soil contamination.
