PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 26-019
ADDING A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 2.400 SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE

SCC 2.400.066 COUNTY FUNDING FOR HOUSING
BE IT ORDAINED:
Section 1. A new section is added to Chapter 2.400 of the Snohomish County Code to read:
2.400.066 County funding for housing.

(1) No solicitation, scoring metric, subrecipient agreement or contract for county funding for housing or for the operation of county-owned housing shall:

(a) Require, incentivize, or give priority to subrecipients or contractors who provide temporary or permanent housing to individuals.

(i) Without any conditions; or
(ii) With minimal entry and/or participation requirements.
(b) Prohibit, discourage, or give lower priority to subrecipients or contractors who include requirements for sobriety, treatment, counseling or illicit drug testing.

(2) This section shall not apply to any state or federal grant or contract that requires or incentivizes the use of such housing and would result in a loss of funding.

(3) For purposes of this section county funding is defined to include any and all direct and pass-through funding awarded by or through the county.

At the Public Hearing, the Council may consider amendments to the proposed ordinance.
