Consideration

The proposed ordinance would grant a non-exclusive franchise authorizing limited use of the public road rights-of-way in portions of unincorporated Snohomish County, Washington to the Mukilteo Water and Wastewater District, under RCW 36.55.010, Snohomish County Charter 9.20, and SCC 13.80.

Background

The Mukilteo Water and Wastewater District has applied to Snohomish County for a non-exclusive franchise to construct, maintain, and operate a water distribution and wastewater conveyance system, within public rights-of-way in unincorporated Snohomish County).

The Mukilteo Water and Wastewater District agrees to comply with all requirements of Federal Law, State Law, County Charter, County Code, the County EDDS, the County's Utility Accommodation Policy, all rights-of-way use permit application, review, and construction standards, including but not limited to the County's Comprehensive Plan, Zoning Code, and other development regulations.

Included in the ECAF packet is an illustration of the franchise area as specified in Section 1.3 of the Franchise and as depicted in Exhibit A of the County Engineers Report with recommendations, which is to grant the right-of-way franchise, under SCC 13.80.040.

Current Proposal

Scope: Approval by Council of this non-exclusive franchise to the Mukilteo Water and Wastewater District.

Duration: The maximum term of twenty (20) years is recommended.

Fiscal Implications: County expenditures are estimated at \$1,000.00, and all costs are to be reimbursed by the applicant to Public Works prior to recording of the franchise.
