CALL TO ORDER

Chair Mead called the Hearing to order at 9:00 a.m.

There being no further persons present wishing to provide testimony, Chair Mead closed the public testimony portion of the hearing.

Chair Mead recessed the Council at 10:32 a.m. to 10:45 a.m.

Chair Mead called the Council back to order at 10:46 a.m.

Prior to Council action, Council Legislative Analysts Jim Martin, Ryan Countryman, Deb Bell, Cynthia Foley, Nicole Gorle, and Chief of Staff Heidi Beazizo, provided staff reports for the budget ordinances, motions, and amendments as listed in order on the agenda. Analysts responded to questions and concerns from councilmembers throughout their staff reports.

 Budget Ordinance 24-074, relating to property taxes, fixing the 2025 General Property Tax Levy for Snohomish County and preserving future levy capacity

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to approve Ordinance 24-074. Councilmember Low seconded the motion. The clerk called the roll and the motion to approve Ordinance 24-074 carried unanimously.

2. Budget Ordinance 24-075, authorizing an increase in general tax revenues for property taxes collected in 2025 and 2026

ACTION: Councilmember Dunn made a motion to approve Ordinance 24-075. Councilmember Peterson seconded the motion.

Councilmember Peterson stated he had a motion (amendment) prepared for a different rate structure and explained it would be for a total of 6% and some change.

Councilmembers provided comments and expressed their views and concerns. Lengthy discussion ensued.

Amendment Sheet 1

Chair Mead made a motion to approve Amendment Sheet 1. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion and it failed two to three, with Councilmembers Nehring, Low, and Peterson voting against.

Amendment Sheet 2

Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to approve Amendment Sheet 2. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it failed two to three, with Councilmembers Mead, Dunn, and Peterson voting against.

Amendment Sheet 3

Councilmember Peterson made a motion to approve Amendment Sheet 3. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion.

Councilmember Low made a motion to amend Amendment Sheet 3 to change the percentage from 2% to 0% [as follows "\$2,250,000 for the 2026 general levy, which is a percentage increase of two (2) zero (0) percent from the previous year"] Chair Mead seconded the motion and it failed one to four with Councilmembers Mead, Nehring, Dunn, and Peterson voting against.

The question was called for on the main Amendment. The motion to approve Amendment 3 failed two to three with Councilmembers Mead, Nehring, and Low voting against.

Reconsideration - Amendment Sheet 1

Councilmember Low made a motion to reconsider Amendment Sheet 1. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Chair Mead made a motion to approve Amendment Sheet 1. Councilmember Dunn seconded the motion and it carried three to two with Councilmembers Low and Nehring voting against.

Main Motion on Ordinance 24-075

The question was called for and the clerk called the roll. The motion to approve Ordinance 24-075, as amended, carried three to two with Councilmembers Nehring and Low voting against.

Every recommendation not previously addressed by Amendment 14B will be included in a Budget Note with a deadline of completion of October 15, 2025, with a workgroup that consists of a workgroup identified in Amendment 25.

ACTION: Councilmember Dunn made a motion to approve Amendment Sheet 27. Vice-Chair Nehring seconded the motion.

Councilmember Dunn made a motion to amend the Amendment Sheet 27 to strike Registration Fees under Expenditures/Council. Strike Travel under Executive, and update Revenues to reflect \$10,000 in 2025 and 2026. Councilmember Peterson seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

The question was called for and the motion to approve Amendment Sheet 27, as amended, carried unanimously.

There being no further amendments to consider, Chair Mead turned to the Council for additional discussion. Each councilmember provided closing remarks.

ACTION: The question was called for and the clerk called the roll. The motion to approve Ordinance 24-083, as amended, carried three to two, with Councilmembers Nehring and Low voting against.

Reconsider Amended Motion 24-417

Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to re-consider the Third Substitute Motion 24-417. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it carried four to one, with CoAuncilmember Dunn voting against.

Discussion ensued and Prosecuting Attorney Jason Cummings provided clarification to amend the Third Substitute Motion 24-417 reflecting changes to expenditures from funds in the 2024 Housing and Behavioral Health Capital Fund Investment Plan that were obligated in Amended Budget Ordinance 24-083. These expenditures are: \$6 million for a secure withdrawal management facility (over two years) and \$3 million for behavioral health facility in Lynnwood.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to amend the Third Substitute Motion as discussed and clarified by Prosecutor Cummings. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it carried four to one, with Councilmember Dunn voting against.

The question was called for and the Third Substitute Motion 24-417, as amended, carried unanimously.

ACTION: Vice-Chair Nehring made a motion to instruct staff to enter all amendments and to produce final documents and tables, adjusting as necessary for DACs and nominal changes in amounts, due to system calculations. Councilmember Low seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

There being no further business, Chair Mead adjourned the Council for the day at 2:07 p.m.
