### **Consideration**

The Executive's Office requests Council consider approving proposed Motion 21-381 which would approve and authorize an agreement between the County and the City of Sultan for Law Enforcement Services.

### **Background**

Snohomish County delivers law enforcement services to different agencies and cities in Snohomish County. The ILA's for those services are similar and the rates for compensation are determined with a similar method.

The county has been providing law enforcement services in the City of Sultan since 2007. The most recent agreement was executed on February 20, 2018 by Motion 18-038.<sup>1</sup>

### **Current Proposal**

*Scope:* Motion 21-381 approves a new agreement for continued delivery of law enforcement services and authorizes the Executive to execute a new agreement.

Snohomish County provided "base level services" within the City's corporate limits that included: one deputy per shift to deliver patrol services; investigative services; special services that may include K-9 patrol, hostage negotiations, SWAT, bomb disposal, sex offender registration, dive team, reserve deputy support, volunteers, and community crime prevention; support services that include planning and research, subpoena control, training, payroll, fleet management, etc.; records management into the RMS Justice System; and evidence maintenance.

To deliver these services, the County designated one (1) Sheriff's Office lieutenant to serve as Chief of Police and four (4) full time dedicated Sheriff deputies.

In addition to compensating Snohomish County for the above services, the City provided the County with an East Precinct office that could be used by deputies dedicated to services within the City.

There are no substantial changes between the proposed new agreement and the previous agreement approved in 2018.
