

## **Flood Voucher Program – December 2025**

### **Solid Waste Division | Snohomish County Public Works**

To support residents impacted by recent flooding, the Solid Waste Division will implement a voucher-based program to waive the **disposal fees for flood-damaged household materials**.

#### **Program Overview**

- **Eligibility:** Residential households only; commercial businesses are excluded.
- **Residency Requirement:** Property must be located within Snohomish County and received flood damage from the recent December 2025 flood event.
- **Voucher Requirement:** Vouchers must be presented at disposal sites.
- **Distribution Points:** Vouchers available through local Red Cross and Sheriff's Office precincts.

- **Program Timeline:** The initial voucher program will run through Sunday, January 18, 2026.
- **Disposal Sites:** A list of solid waste disposal facilities is located on the back of each voucher and may found on the following website: <https://snohomishcountywa.gov/465/Facility-Locations>

#### **Accepted Materials**

- Flood-damaged household items: carpets, mattresses, clothing, furniture, water-soaked plasterboard, food, and appliances (excluding refrigerators/freezers).
- Small quantities of incidental paint and household hazardous waste.
- Larger quantities of household hazardous waste must be brought to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility in Everett.

#### **Not Accepted**

- Wood waste, yard debris, concrete, demolition debris, rock, soil.
- Large animal carcasses (not accepted at any facility).

#### **Additional Notes**

- Households may request multiple vouchers.
- Vouchers may be used to cover disposal fees for roll-off boxes from commercial haulers; residents are responsible for delivery/transport fees.
